Presidents report

It gives me great pleasure to present this report outlining some of the important activities undertaken by the Bellarine Catchment Network (BCN) during the past year. The Network continues to be well supported by environmental groups and develop partnerships with other land managers on the Bellarine. These lead to important programs and initiatives that provide greater environmental education and involvement.

BCN continued to invest time and resources into all other community environment groups and land manager partners. These partnerships are extremely important to BCN. Our Caring For Our Bays Program received new funding from the Port Phillip Bay Fund and continues to attract support from partner organizations and new businesses. We were able to launch a new environmental booklet in Ocean Grove, deliver the third installment in the Biodiversity in Your Backyard series and sponsor a local Port Phillip Bay swim event in the Wreck2Reef.

Our partnerships with community groups and organizations remain strong and continue to grow. In doing so this supports local programs, communities and schools in all towns and areas of the Bellarine. I would like to thank the entire network representatives and all delegates for their ongoing contribution and commitment to their particular group, organisation and to the Bellarine Catchment Network.

My long term colleague John Fyfe is also stepping down as Secretary. John has been a previous BCN President and Secretary for the past 5 years. Every year the Bellarine Catchment Network (BCN) achieves numerous outcomes and projects on the Bellarine with various community groups, partners and agencies. Not unlike previous years, the activities for this year continued to grow. This year the BCN committee and staff achieved the following new initiatives:

- New vehicle sponsorship for on ground works, community engagement and involvement.
- BCN information packs developed, printed and provided to Bellarine and Geelong community groups and organisations.
- Reviewed, updated and reprinted 5,000 copies of the Indigenous Wildlife of the Bellarine brochure.
- Planning, development and implementation of Ocean Grove Environment Booklet.
- New initiatives with Geelong Sustainability, 100Clean Bellarine and Plastic Wise Bellarine.
- Represented the Caring for Our Bays (CFOB) program at the 'Wreck2Reef' swim, presented at the City of Greater Geelong (CoGG) 'World Environment Day Awards' to 150 delegates and Barwon South West Waste and Resource Recovery Group (BSWWRRG) board meeting.
- Attended the 2018 PakoFesta engaging over 200 participants.
- Purchase of 450 KeepCups with the CFOB logo to be used at festivals and events.
- Organised a community coastal erosion monitoring workshop and initiated the Point Lonsdale Sand Monitoring Program.
- Barwon Estuary Project game development and steering group.
- CoGG school holiday program delivery.





In addition to new projects, the BCN also have many ongoing annual projects and programs with our partner organisations and many educational institutions across Geelong and the Bellarine Peninsula. Below is a summary of these projects:

BCN supported Barwon Estuary Project officer interview and appointment process. Attended and represented meetings for Barwon Estuary Project resources including board game and nature diary.

Bellarine Environment Centre

Ongoing maintenance, cleaning and IT support for 5 BCN/Bellarine Landcare Group (BLG) staff. Infrastructure upgrades to shed and workshop facilities. Regular maintenance of facility.

Bellarine Indian Myna Program

This program was unable to be run this year due to resourcing. A review of the program was recently undertaken and the project is on hold until 2019.

Bellarine Rail Trail Fellows Rd Revegetation Day

This year (2017) marked the 9th year that this revegetation day has run in conjunction with Swan Bay Environment Association (SBEA), Queenscliff PS, the Borough of Queenscliffe (BoQ) and GJ Garner Homes. The Queenscliff Nursery once again provided plants and a location for a celebratory BBQ following the event.

Bellarine Rail Trail/VicTrack program

Priority works for this year included Golden Wreath Wattle removal works with a groomer. There has been ongoing rabbit control planning. High biodiversity zones are being controlled for Wild Watsonia. Two school planting days have occurred in Queenscliff.

This collaboration was again not undertaken this year. However, plans have been put into place to work with the Bellarine Secondary College year 9 "Life in community (linC)" program in 2019.

Biodiversity in Your Backyard

This year is the third time that the Potato Shed has hosted the Biodiversity in Your Backyard event. This years focus was 'Art and the Environment' and included 12 artists covering a variety of mediums.

Bonnyvale Wetlands

This year marked the 9th year collaborating with the Corangamite Catchment Management Authority (CCMA), Barwon Coast and Ocean Grove Coastcare. Students participated in revegetation and water quality testing activities.

Caring for our Bays

The CFOB program continued to gather strength this year. Around 20 community volunteers were able to complete over 100 litter audits around Geelong and the Bellarine, collecting up to 18,000 items of litter. The program received attention for 2 awards and key note presentations were given at the City of Greater Geelong Environment Day and at the Barwon South West Waste Resource Recovery Group (BSWWRRG).

Clifton Springs and Curlewis Coastcare Group Development

The newly established Clifton Springs and Curlewis Coastcare group were involved in the establishment of the Caring for Our Bays mural at the Clifton Springs Boat Ramp. The unveiling of the mural had high attendance and the mural is still in tact.

Once again, Clifton Springs PS joined BCN at the Clifton Springs Boat Ramp for their annual environment day. Over 60 students braved the wet conditions to participate in 4 activities helped run by City of Greater Geelong staff, Drysdale Clifton Springs Community Association members and Caring for Our Bays volunteers.

Coastcare Grant - Summer By The Sea and SLSC Nippers

This year we collaborated with Bellarine Bayside, City of Greater Geelong, Ocean Grove Coastcare and the Ocean Grove Surf Life Saving Club. A total of 210 participants engaged with the SBTS program through beachcomb and craft activities and educational games.

Gardens for Wildlife

In conjunction with the SBEA, BoQ and BCN received funding to restart the Gardens for Wildlife program in Queenscliff and Point Lonsdale. In addition, an Ocean Grove/Barwon Heads pilot program was planned through Ocean Grove Coastcare Group with support from CoGG for execution within 2018-2019.

Geelong Cemeteries Trust – Leopold and Point Lonsdale

We once again collaborated with the Geelong Cemeteries Trust for both Leopold and Point Lonsdale cemeteries. Works included revegetation, weed removal and community planting days where over 50 people attended. 210 people

M2M: Greening the Songline

This year we became involved in the Mountain 2 Mouth (M2M) Greening the Songline program, aimed at celebrating the 80km extreme arts and culture trail. BCN planted 400 plants at Big Rock where over 50 people volunteered. The Greening the Songline initiative achieved 10,100 plants, involving 21 community groups and organisations with 935 volunteers. Many of these were facilitated and supported by BCN.

Moolap Saltworks Site and Rep.

Work in collaboration with Birdlife Australia, Geelong Field Naturalists Club and Geelong Environmental Council to lobby Government for protection of the site. Attend meeting and joint letter signatories with above groups to relevant authorities.

Narrows Revegetation Day

This was 9th annual revegetation day at the Narrows. A collaboration with BoQ, SBEA and BCN focusing on the coastal moonah woodland community. Activities included revegetation, plant identification and weeding.

Ocean Grove Coastcare - Governers Place Revegetation Day

This project followed on from May 2017 planting. Continued site maintenance, preparation for further weed control and revegetation has been undertaken. This has been a partnership between BCN, CoGG, BCCoM and Ocean Grove Coastcare.

Ocean Grove Environmental Booklet Development

After many years of collaboration, the Ocean Grove Environmental Booklet was finally completed and printed. Over 100 local residents and community representatives attended the booklet launch earlier in the year. A collaboration with 14 community groups, organisations and businesses.

Ocean Grove PS - Coastcare Environment Day

This year we engaged with Barwon Coast and Ocean Grove Coastcare to deliver 4 activities to Ocean Grove PS. These included the Coastcare game, revegetation activities, a flora and fauna talk and a Hooded Plover game.

PakoFesta

This year we were invited to attend and share a space and support Geelong Sustainability at the annual PakoFesta in Geelong. At our stall we engaged with over 200 people through poster making and CFOB related craft activities.

Point Lonsdale PS Environment Day

Annual environment day consisting of a Coastcare game, beachcomb and fauna and flora walk 'n' talk. This day links the Point Lonsdale Primary School with their local environment including Port Phillip Heads Marine National Park, foreshore habitat and coastal Moonah woodland.

The Point – EVC Management and Community Engagement Program

The Point partnership seeks to restore various EVC's within 'The Point'/Moremac land parcel excluding water responsibilities. A community planting day was held with 40 people attending.

Queenscliff Music Festival

The 2017 QMF marked the second consecutive year that BCN have collaborated with the festival. Over 160 people participated in the interactive displays, including revegetation activities, poster making and a hands on beachcomb. This relationship will continue for years to come.

Queenscliff Narrows Project and Coastal Moonah Woodland Restoration

This projects brings together Bellarine Second College year 12 Outdoor Education students, Geelong Lutheran College year 11 Outdoor Education students, Gordon TAFE Conservation and Land Management students and Christian College Geelong students.

Queenscliff Primary School: Environment Day

Biodiversity in Your Backyard

This event was the third Biodiversity in Your Backyard event and showcased six presentations featuring local, national and international artists and included sculpture, poetry, soundscape, painting, photography and dramatic performance.

The theme was 'Art and the Environment'. Each artist presented their piece and shared stories about the creative journey behind their works and their connection to the Bellarine's natural environment.

A total of 12 artists presented at the Potato Shed to 145 guests. Representatives from many partner organisations attended including the CCMA, BoQ, CoGG and many community groups.

The booklet contains over 160 images contributed by over 56 community members. After printing 3,000 copies, another 5,000 were printed due to popular demand.

Indigenous Wildlife of the Bellarine




Bellarine Catchment and Ocean Grove Coastcare Info Packs


