Growling Grass Frogs live amongst reeds, sedges and rushes growing beside slow flowing freshwater sources such as swamps and wetlands. Their distinctive call of several short grunts followed by a long deep 'growl' can be heard during the warmer months.



Wadawurrung Cultural Heritage Fact

Wadawurrung people would hear the sound of the Growling Grass Frog it would mean happy. This meant that the water body was healthy and food sources were abundant.

How Can I Help?

- ✓ Record sightings on iNaturalist
- ✓ Protect and restore habitat around dams and waterways by planting suitable vegetation
- ✓ Walk on pathways to protect vegetation around waterways
- ✓ Fence off dams to protect vegetation from livestock
- ✓ Keep litter and pollutants out of waterways
